GENERAL INFORMATION

For a pastoral call, notify the pastor or an elder.

The consistory meets the first Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m.

The council meets the third Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m.

The deacons meet on the last Thursday of the month at 7:30 p.m.

The sacrament of baptism is administered on the fourth Sunday of the month. Baptismal arrangements can be made at any consistory meeting.

The Lord's supper is administered on the third Sunday of February, May, August, and November. Any visitor who desires to partake of the Lord's supper must receive permission from the consistory. Those who are communicant members in another Protestant Reformed congregation or a sister church can receive such permission prior to the service at which the Lord's supper is celebrated. All other visitors must appear at a consistory meeting prior to the celebration of the Lord's supper.

Bulletin announcements must be given to the bulletin secretary by 4:00 p.m. Friday.

Material for public programs and for distribution in the church must be approved by the program committee.
