#### **DATES & EVENTS**

October 12, 1941	First broadcast "Protestant Reformed Hour" on WLAV, Grand Rapids, Rev. Herman Hoeksema spoke on theme "GOD IS GOD"
1941	First "Protestant Reformed Radio Choir"
December 7, 1941	Announcement of the attack on Pearl Harbor was made immediately following the broadcast (see page 101 of "God's Covenant Faithfulness")
November 17, 1946	200th Broadcast - Rev. Herman Hoeksema
1950	Broadcast now on 3 stations
1955	Radio equipment temporarily moved from First Church basement to Ed Kooienga's home.
1960	Now on 6 radio stations
March 11, 1962	1000th Broadcast – Rev. Herman Hoeksema
1960's	Broadcast heard on shortwave via Transworld Radio. Fruit of this broadcasting is seen in our mission field in Jamaica.
1970	We are now broadcasting on 9 stations.
May, 1972	Reformed Witness Hour began printing and mailing their own broadcast copies.
1980	The broadcast is being aired on 13 stations.
May 10, 1981	2000th Broadcast – Prof. Robert Decker
